

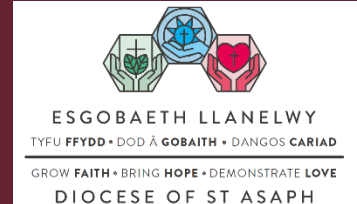



Sharing information

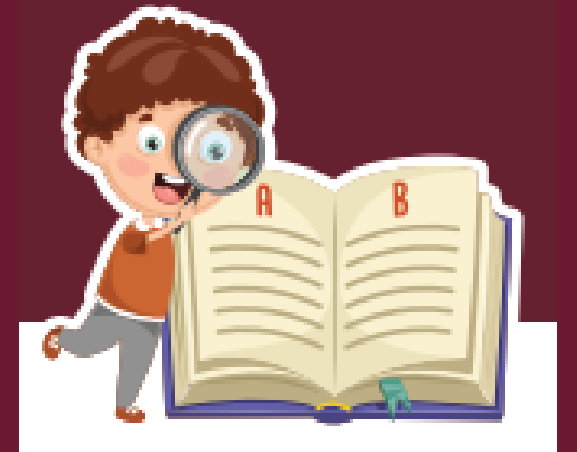
- Regular communication
